April 1-7 Is National Public Health Week

WINNEBAGO COUNTY – Each year the first week of April is designated as National Public Health Week (NPHW), a time to recognize the contributions of public health and bring awareness to the issues that impact health in our communities. The theme for National Public Health Week 2024 is *Protecting, Connecting and Thriving: We Are All Public Health*.

The Winnebago County Health Department (WCHD) will be taking part in NPHW by recognizing our residents and partners role in shaping the health and in sharing ongoing efforts to better health in our community.
